- As they listen, they learn new words and their meanings.


### **Books That Support Talking**

## Fun to try at home...

#### Play rhyming games.

Start with an object and see how many words you can think of. (Example: hat...cat...sat) Even made up words are ok.

#### Talk about food.

Have your child help with meals when they're able to. Talk about what you're using, or doing. Identify colors, names, and tasks.

## Fun on the go...

Point out signs and labels when you're out.

Talking about what different signs mean helps your child understand the words and symbols around them.

Play "I spy" while out and about.
