Books That Support Reading

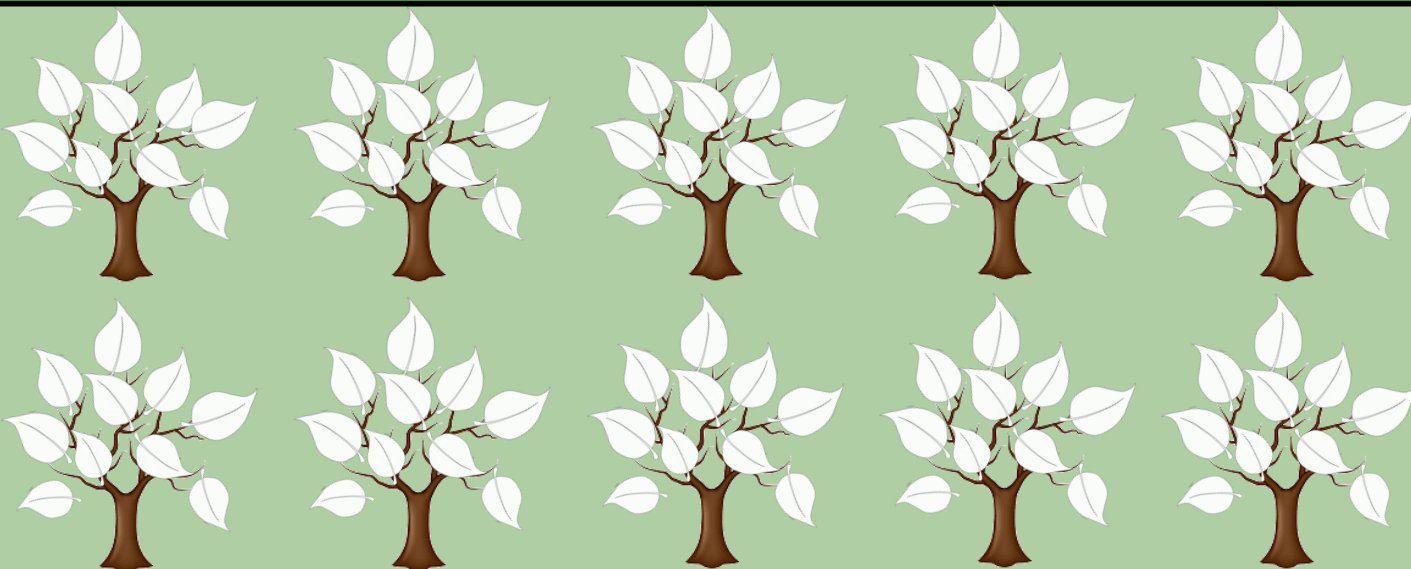
- Books that follow your child's interests

Beavers eat leaves, roots, and bark.

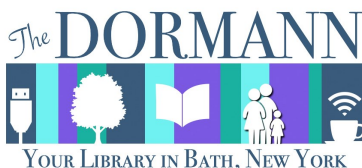
